MEETING MINUTES



June 5, 2024, COSGPAA Meeting Minutes

Attendees: 17 in person; 154 by e-mail

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 pm by Chapter President Tim Pitney and began with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Tim welcomed everyone to the meeting and congratulated member Stephen Kanatzar on becoming a GPAA Life Member. Tim discussed the May outing to the Railroad Bridge Claims and the historic Arrastre in Buena Vista, and the May Poker Run sponsored by the Gold Prospectors of Colorado (GPOC). Recent rains and early snowmelt had the water in the Arkansas River higher than expected, but access to areas in the riverbed below the high-water mark was still possible. But setting a sluice was a challenge. The treasure hunt around the Arrastre for Aztec gold and silver only found more questions than answers. The Spanish Monuments indicating the presence of a treasure still hold their secrets. Future trips may be planned. Participants in the Poker Run enjoyed socializing with those of like mind even though the weather (rain & snow) and high water made prospecting "uncomfortable". The pot-luck dinner and poker prizes were "icing on the cake". Thank you GPOC for inviting us. The trip home was also exciting with multiple rockslides partially blocking Highway 50.





It all started with a lifetime membership and a free Minelab Gold Monster 1000. Since then, pretty much all my gold dreams have come true. (not without some serious effort though).



While not all of this gold is from GPAA claims, the GPAA claims are where I started, how I learned to read topo maps, use coordinates, understand mineral claims, understand the geology of many areas and eventually that all lead me to "see what else is out there" on other ground. Somewhere along the way, I managed to find a pretty rich area. I will forever tell people about the GPAA and I ALWAYS recommend it as a starting point to anyone new to the hobby.
