September 4, 2024, COSGPAA Meeting Minutes

Attendees: 20 in person; 154 by e-mail

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Chapter President Tim Pitney and began with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Tim discussed prospecting reports he has received during the past month, mostly indicating that water levels were still too high in most locations, which is unusual this late in the year. 

Directions: From the intersection of South Powers Blvd and East Fountain Blvd, drive East on Fountain one block to the first left turn, which is N. Newport Road. You will see the "airplane" that is part of the restaurant in the NE corner of that intersection.
